St. Louis County Family Court maintains a zero tolerance for juvenile on juvenile sexual offense, staff sexual misconduct and sexual harassment towards juveniles. Every allegation of a sexual offense, staff sexual misconduct and sexual harassment towards juveniles shall be thoroughly investigated.

Please report any concerns about your child's treatment to either the Duty Supervisor; Assigned Deputy Juvenile Officer or Detention Administration.

Anyone can report concerns including third parties such as other youth, family members, attorneys and advocates.

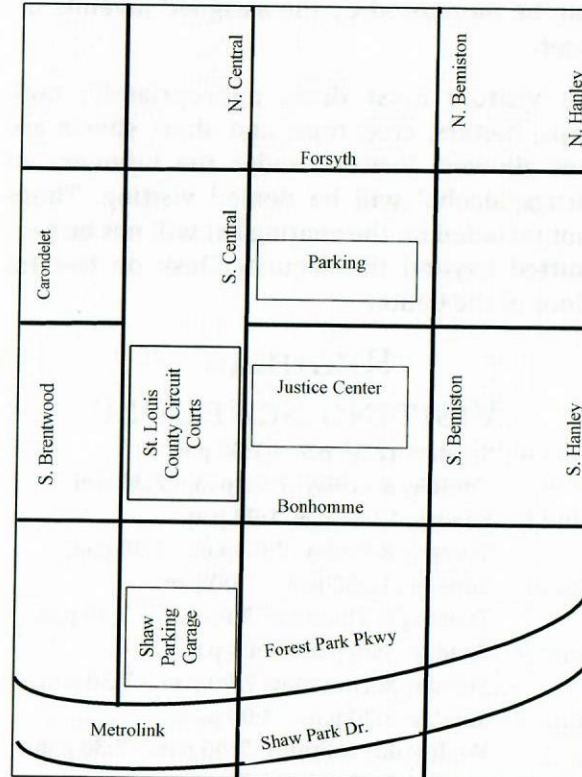

## THE DETENTION CENTER

The Detention Center of the Family Court of St. Louis County provides for the safe and secure custody of juveniles alleged to have committed an offense that brings them within the jurisdiction of the Court. These juveniles are detained only if it is believed that they present a threat to themselves or the community. They remain in Detention until the Court hears their case or until appropriate alternative arrangements can be made.

### DETENTION SERVICES

The Detention Center provides for the basic needs of its residents: shelter, food, clothing and medical care. But just as importantly, the Center's staff provides a wide range of support services intended to help promote the juveniles physical, social and emotional development. These services include drug and alcohol counseling, arts and crafts, self-help programs, educational and vocational services, fitness sessions, voluntary religious services, recreational programs and many other activities.

The Special School District of St. Louis County provides educational programming for Detention residents both during the regular school year and during the summer months. Teachers are specially trained to work with adolescents who have learning and behavior problems.

The Department of Health of St. Louis County provides a registered nurse, a nurse practitioner and visiting physician. The Center's medical program is accredited through the National Commission on Correctional Health.

## VISITING

Only parents and legal guardians designated on the visiting list are allowed to visit. Picture identification is required. During the first 24 hours of a juvenile's detention, parents and legal guardians may visit anytime between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. After that, the regular visiting schedule applies. Attorneys may visit at any reasonable hour.

Items not medically required (for example food, gum, candy, tobacco, toothpaste, etc.) should not be brought to visiting. If contraband is brought into the facility, visiting privileges will be revoked until supervised visits can be monitored by the assigned juvenile officer.

All visitors must dress appropriately; tank tops, halters, crop tops, and short shorts are not allowed. Visitors under the influence of drugs/alcohol will be denied visiting. Those not included on the visiting list will not be permitted beyond the Security Desk on the 1st floor of the Center.

Open visiting (10:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.) will be permitted on New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Mother's Day, Easter Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

### PHONE CALLS

When juveniles are admitted to the Center, they may immediately telephone their parent or guardian. Thereafter, such phone calls will be permitted only at designated times determined by the Center. Phone calls to other relatives or friends are not allowed nor will the Center accept personal incoming calls for residents. Phone contact by the juvenile with his or her attorney or deputy juvenile officer is permitted.

Parents are encouraged to contact the Shift Supervisor, or call (314) 615-2996 if there are questions, or concerns during their child's stay in the Detention Center

### MAIL

All mail must be delivered through the U.S. Postal Service system and will be searched for contraband. Juveniles are permitted to write two outgoing letters per day. If you wish to write your child the mailing address is:
