

# ST. LOUIS COUNTY DRUG COURT OVERVIEW

## **Phase I** ASSESSMENT AND INTENSIVE SUPERVISION PHASE (12 Weeks\*)

- A. Comprehensive assessment to identify treatment, employment, educational, family and other pertinent issues and needs.
- B. Development of treatment plan with the Drug Court Team.
- C. Begin treatment which could include detoxification, inpatient treatment and/or intensive outpatient treatment. Treatment will be available in the evening hours for offenders who are employed. Treatment can also include significant other.
- D. Weekly appearance before the Drug Court Judge.
- E. Random urinalysis
- F. Weekly meeting with Probation Officer and follow all directives of Probation Officer.
- G. Must be engaged in a 12 step program and obtain a sponsor.
- H. Contacts with family or significant others on an as needed basis.
- I. Possible home visit.
- J. Employment verification biweekly.
- K. Pay \$20.00 per court appearance or \$80.00 per month for drug court fees.

*\*This requirement may be increased based upon my progress in the program.*

### **Treatment**

Level 2 - Out patient treatment, consist of three (3) days a week, three hours each day. Morning and evening hours are available.

## **Phase II** PRIMARY TREATMENT PHASE (20 Weeks\*)

- A. Continuation of treatment with provider based on individual needs.
- B. Court appearance every 2 weeks. Pay \$40.00 per court appearance or \$80.00 per month for drug court fees.
- C. Random urinalysis
- D. One weekly face-to-face contact with Probation Officer.
- E. Contact with family or significant others on an as needed basis.
- F. Possible home visit.
- G. Monthly employment verification
- H. 20 hours of community service.
- I. Must be engaged in a 12 step program and have regular contact with sponsor.

*\*This requirement may be increased based upon my progress in the program.*

### **Treatment**

Level 3 - Out patient treatment, consist of one (1) day a week, for two hours. Morning and evening hours are available.

## **Phase III** CONTINUED CARE AND SUPERVISION (20 Weeks\*)

- A. Continued treatment, aftercare with provider as needed.
- B. Court appearance once a month. Pay \$80.00 per court appearance for drug court fees.
- C. Random urinalysis.
- D. Minimum of 2 face-to-face contacts per month with Probation Officer.
- E. Monthly contact with significant other.
- F. Possible home visit.
- G. 20 hours of community service.
- H. Monthly employment verification.
- I. Must be engaged in a 12 step program and have regular contact with sponsor.

*\*This requirement may be increased based upon my progress in the program.*

**Phase IV** MINIMUM SUPERVISION OR COMMENCEMENT PHASE (13 Weeks\*)

- A. Random urinalysis.
- B. Court appearance once a month.
- C. Minimum of one face-to-face contact with probation officer per month.
- D. Possible home visit.
- E. Continue treatment of one (1) hour per month of individual counseling.
- F. Possible continuance of interlock device or other chemical monitoring device.
- G. Pay \$80.00 per month for drug court fees.
- H. Must be engaged in a 12 step program and have regular contact with sponsor.

*\*This requirement may be increased based upon my progress in the program.*

**No use of any type of illicit substances or alcoholic beverages is permitted while participating in the drug court program. Not permitted to frequent any bars or any establishment where the primary item for sale is alcohol. Not permitted to consume any item which may contain poppy seeds.**

*Continued violations or willful failure to comply with any item within any phases may result in a negative sanction being imposed and may result in revocation of probation. Positive and negative sanction will include, but are not limited to the following:*

- Rewards:
- 1. Positive re-enforcement from the Judge and Drug Court Team.
  - 2. Decreased court costs.
  - 3. Coupons or gift certificates.
  - 4. Case dismissed or early termination from probation.

- Sanctions:
- 1. Additional community service;
  - 2. Additional court appearances;
  - 3. Additional group or individual treatment sessions;
  - 4. Additional 12-step or support meetings;
  - 5. Electronic monitoring;
  - 6. A period of incarceration;
  - 7. Residential treatment;
  - 8. Prison tour and write paper regarding your feelings of what you experienced;
  - 9. CHOICES Program;
  - 10. Termination;
  - 11. Other sanctions or treatment as directed by the Drug Court Team.

Defendant with full-time employment is required to appear in Drug Court as established by the court. I have read the above "St. Louis County Drug Court Overview".
